Need Based Training on Business Plan for FPOs

On May 02, 2019 a Need Based Training on Business Plan for FPOs was conducted at Kachubari, Mariampur of Goalpara district for both the FPOs. The resource person of the programme was Shri. S. N. Roy, DDM, NABARD. A total of 34 (Thirty four) farmers participated in the training. The objective of the training is to encourage and promote the FPO members whose main activities includes the business planning and marketing of their produces. At the end of the training session, they finalised the collection process and selling of their products. They also planned to expand their membership to other project villages.

Bosco Reach Out has promoted two FPOs covering 19 (Nineteen) project villages with the 400 (Four Hundred) rubber growing wadi beneficiaries of TDF project and other non-wadi rubber growing beneficiaries. These two FPOs namely Twelve Villages Farmers Producer Organization Cooperative Society Limited at Mariampur and Nanajyoti Anchalik Krishak Samabay Samiti Limited at Kachubari, Mariampur are formed and supported by NABARD for two years initially. The main crop of both the FPOs is rubber under the TDF BOLGRIM project. They are also growing broom and banana extensively as intercrop with rubber plant since the beginning of the project.



Graduation Day of Computer Training for Youth at Risk, Umrangso

On May 22, 2019 Bosco Reach Out Socio-Developmental Centre, Umrangso organized Graduation Day for the second batch of Computer Training for Youth at Risk cum farewell to Fr. Sebastian Ishoray, Associate Director of BRO. The students presented a beautiful farewell song and farewell speech. The outgoing batch students expressed their gratitude to BRO for taking up such training centre in their surrounding area. They mentioned that many of the unemployed youth got training and seek for job opportunity. Fr. Sebastian in his speech encouraged to the students. He advised them to properly utilised the centre facilities and do well in their life. He also told them to spread about the computer training to other places, in and around villages so that they also get the benefit. The programme concluded with distribution of certification to the students concerned followed by tea and snacks.

Computer Training for Youth at Risk has been implemented at Bosco Reach Out Socio-Developmental Centre, Umrangso since in 2018 with the support of **Don Bosco Mission Bonn, Germany** with an objective that the youth at risk from border area of Dima Hasao district are trained in computer skills to gain meaningful employment and is mainstreamed into society. There are 20 computer set for the training the students and three staff were employed for the centre. Students were divided into two batches a day. During this year 51 students have enrolled at the centre for certificate course on computer of three months.





Training on Inclusive Education for Disability

Training on Inclusive Education for Disability for the project staff was conducted at Bosco Reach Out, Guwahati on June 11 and 12, 2019. The project is supported by Light For The World Austria. Specific objective of the training is to understand Inclusive education, importance of Inclusive Education, develop inclusive schools, components of Inclusive Education, and base line study for Inclusive Education. The resource persons for the training were from Shishu Sarothi, Guwahati namely Ms. Mamta Ghosh, Coordinator, Key Teacher and Ms. Lisa Beypi, Advocacy Coordinator (RAISE). The curriculum of the training programme was developed by the resource person from Shishu Sarothi. The training was presented as a framework of characteristics and competencies, designed to guide and support the staff members for data collection.

On the first day, the resources persons discussed in-depth on topics of Inclusive Education, United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (UNCRPD), Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPWD) Act, 2016, and Right to Education Act (RTE). Video Presentation on the child's daily activities from morning till night like getting to school, arriving at school, break time, sports time etc. On the second day, important topics covered were Tools of Data Collection and Attitude, Communication, Accessibility, and Participation.

On June 13, 2019 the project staff of **Inclusive Education for Disability** accompanied by the resource persons from Shishu Sarothi Guwahati visited Montfort School Khanapara, Guwahati, Shishu Sarothi Centre for Rehabilitation and Training of Multiple Disability Ulubari, Guwahati and **Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan** Rupnagar, Guwahati. During the visit the project staff observed the facilities and the situation of the classrooms, library, toilets, etc. in schools. The main objective of the visit was to observe how a school can be inclusive, what are the factors and component of an Inclusive school. Through this exposure visit the project staff could experience how an inclusive school is different from a special school and Govt. School.



Survey on Including Children with Disabilities in Education

During the months of June and July 2019 a survey was conducted on including children with disabilities in 27 Don Bosco Schools of Assam and Meghalaya. The topics for the data collected through school survey are accessibility, class room environment, education services, additional curriculum, school development committee, policies and system with an objective to know the present situation of the Don Bosco Schools.

The Bosco Reach Out staff visited all the 27 schools of Assam and Meghalaya. The survey followed the questioner of Include Vidya Campaign (CBM) as per the guidelines provided. With the completion of the 27 don Bosco schools survey the data collected are being computerised and analysed. The complied report of the survey will be presented on the national conference on October 24 and 25, 2019, titled “*Including Children with Disabilities in Education*”.





Children Sponsorship Programme

Competitions on dancing, singing and Drawing and Flowers Arrangement were organised during this season at various schools where many of the sponsored children took part and won prizes. Clean Environment Drive on World Environmental Day at various centres was conducted where students were engaged in cleaning their school, hostel and outside premises. At the same time instructions were given on environmental problems of Global Warming and importance of planting of trees. The children brought plants from their garden and planted in the school campus. It was very interesting to see their enthusiasm and love to make their school campus clean and green.

On August 15, Independence Day was observed with great honours at all schools. This year Auxilium Lum Jingshai Secondary School, Mawroh sent 33 students and three teachers to participate in the parade held at Mairang sub-division a distance about 23 kilometers from their school. The school students were awarded as the Best Discipline School among 28 school participants. They returned with great joy and happiness carrying the Trophy and the Certificate of their victory.

Every year in July during the children school summer vacations, the Snehalaya centre organises Summer Camp for their children by taking them to places away from Guwahati to rural areas under the supervision of the authorities. The children get a break and get engaged in group activities like helping the cooks by cleaning the vegetables, cleaning, paddy cultivation, fishing etc. and other playful activities like telling stories etc. After coming back from the camps, children go back to their respective schools with much happiness and enthusiasm.

The sponsored children of the Children Sponsorship Programme with the support of Fondazione Fratelli Dimenticati Onlus, Italy took part in various school activities and programmes with great enthusiasm at their respective centres.





Promotion and Mobilization Programme under BAGAN project

On May 25, 2019 Bosco Reach Out conducted promotion and mobilisation programme at Malivita, Sidli block, Chirang district of Assam for the selection of new second phase beneficiaries of TDF – BAGAN project. The first phase has been already successfully grounded in 2018 at 22 villages of Malivita VCDC. The overall Objective of the programme was to create awareness regarding integrated tribal development project on multiple crop orchard/ Wadi development, to mobilize farmers for their greater participation in the project, and to promote the concept of the project.

The programme was inaugurated by Mr. Gautam Talukdar, ACS, Deputy Commissioner, Chirang district, the Chief Guest of the programme. Fr. A. Jayaprakash, Executive Director of Bosco Reach Out Guwahati and Ms. Leena Mohurle, AGM, NABARD, Assam Regional Office, Guwahati were present in the programme. There were more than 80 farmer's families of Malivita VCDC of Sidli block at the programme. Other dignitaries and invitees present at the programme were Mr. Johnny Narzary, Chairman of VCDC Malivita, Mr. Premal Narzary, Govt. school teacher, Malivita, Mr. Jonota Narzary, President Malivita Primary BPF, Mr. Koken Narzary, Goanbura, and Smt. Minku Das the Programme Coordinator of Bosco Reach Out Guwahati.

Fr. A. Jayaprakash, Executive Director of BRO delivered his welcome speech followed by keynote address by Smt. Minku Das, Programme Coordinator of BRO. Ms. Leena Mohurle, AGM, NABARD, Assam addressed the farmers and explained the ambition of NABARD towards development of tribal population of the country. Mr. Gautam Talukdar, ACS, Deputy Commissioner, Chirang district addressed the participants and explained the role of district administration in development of the villages in terms of health, education, infrastructure, law and order.

At the end of programme, 100 Water Wheels were distributed to women beneficiaries under women drudgery reduction head of women development component in the first phase. A symbolic planting material was conducted among second phase beneficiaries to encourage mobilized the participants to join the programme with greater enthusiasm.



Farmers' Training and Demonstration under BAGAN Project

Bosco Reach Out conducted farmers' training and demonstration under training and capacity building programme of TDF-Bagan project on May 7, 8 and 9, 2019 at villages of Gwjwnpuri, Sonapur Lalai, No.2 Jomnaguri, Chirang district respectively. A total of 49 farmers participate the training programme. The resource persons were Ms. Minku Das, Horticulture Specialist of BRO, Mr. Jion Narzary, Project Field Coordinator of BRO, Mr. Jual Mochahary Rabha, Field Staff of BRO, Mr. Kanin Basumatary, Field Staff of BRO, and Mr. Prabial Narzary, Community Mobilizer of BRO. Topics covered were concept sharing on layout of multiple horticulture crop orchard and package of practices of Orange and areca nut were conducted to improve knowledge on scientific method of horticulture plantation and management practices, to create awareness on intercultural operation – weeding, mulching, plant protection etc for young plantation, to promote intercropping for optimum utilization and extra income and to promote Soil conservation methods and water resource development. The most important training contents were land preparation, spacing, pit digging, manure application, secondary nursery bed and proper fencing specially use of green fencing. Planting method and layout of wadi was explained in details. Management practices, intercultural operations for young orchard and method of pitcher drip irrigation were also covered.



The objectives of the programme was to improve knowledge on scientific method of horticulture plantation and management practices, to create awareness on intercultural operation – weeding, mulching, plant protection etc for young plantation, to promote intercropping for optimum utilization and extra income and to promote Soil conservation methods and water resource development. The most important training contents were land preparation, spacing, pit digging, manure application, secondary nursery bed, method of pitcher drip irrigation and proper fencing specially use of green fencing.



Input Support Distribution

Bosco Reach Out, under the project 'Agriculture Development Programme for Tribal People of North Garo Hills of Meghalaya' conducted input support distribution programme at four different villages of the project implementation during the month of May 2019. A total number of 5200 **Karimunda** variety of black peppers was distributed to 130 families, 2750 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants to 11 families, and 680 Assam Lemon sapling to 34 families. Mr. Ramendra Rabha, Project coordinator and Br. Michael Kindo, Administrator were present for the distribution of the input supports.

On May 01, 2019 at Gokolgre village 50 families received 2000 **Karimunda** variety of black peppers, seven families received 750 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants and 11 families received 220 Assam lemon saplings. On May 02, 2019 at **Dingrepa** village 31 families received 1240 **Karimunda** variety of black peppers, seven families received 750 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants and 13 families received 260 Assam lemon saplings. On May 03, 2019 at **Wako Asimgre** village 39 families received 1560 **Karimunda** variety of black peppers, five families received 1250 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants and three families received 60 Assam lemon saplings. On May 04, 2019 at **Chichotcheng** village 10 families received 400 **Karimunda** variety of black peppers, and seven families received 140 Assam lemon saplings.





On Field Demonstration at Farmer's Field for Transfer of Technology

In the month of June 2019, Bosco Reach Out conducted **On Field Demonstration at Farmer's Field for Transfer of Technology** under the project 'Agriculture Development Programme for Tribal people of North Garo Hills District of Meghalaya, North East India'. The objective of the project is to improve the capacity of rural farmers for better management of the available resources through support service on training and field demonstration, technology transfer, improved input supply, and disease prevention programme. The project will cover approximately 350 families from seven villages under Bajengdopa block, North Garo Hills district of Meghalaya.

During the field demonstration the beneficiaries were provided with **Karimunda** variety of black pepper, **Kew** variety of pineapple plants, and Assam Lemon for demonstration purposes. Ms. Beltina Marak of Gokolgre village for demonstration purposes was provided with 65 **Karimunda** variety of black peppers, 300 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants, and 30 Assam Lemon, Ms. **Isilda Marak of Dingrepa village with 30 Karimunda** variety of black peppers, 300 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants, and 50 Assam Lemon, Ms. **Sopolina Momin of Wako Aimgre village with 65 Karimunda** variety of black peppers, 300 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants, and 30 Assam Lemon, and Ms. **Lamoni Sangma of Chichotcheng village with 65 Karimunda** variety of black peppers, 300 **Kew** variety of pineapple plants, and 30 Assam Lemon.





Integrated Farming System

Bosco Reach Out in collaboration with Bethany Society, Shillong is implementing Integrated Farming System at two centres of BRO Agriculture Training Centre Joropara and BRO Rongjeng Centre in Garo Hills district of Meghalaya under Supporting Human Capital Development in Meghalaya, ADP and Meghalaya Skill Development Society. The objective of the project is to improve the living conditions of landless households in a sustainable manner and use simple income generation models based on appropriate technology. The trainings contain 1 hour classroom inputs and the remaining time spent on practical. Delivery includes lectures, discussions, group activities, videos and regular assessment which will include group presentations and individual objective type questions and oral questions and assessment of practical work.

Course Content Syllabus includes Integrated farming system - Concept of integrated farming system, and Different components of integrated farming; Compost preparation - Bokashi compost, Vertical compost, Vermi compost, Bokashi bucket; Bio fertilizer- Liquid manure, Oriental herbal nutrient, Fish amino acid, Fermented plant juice, Fermented fruit juice, Bamboo vinegar, Indigenous micro organism, LABs; Bokashi piggery; Bokashi poultry; Beekeeping; Rice husk charcoal; Agriculture - Keyhole farming, Hot bed nursery; Gardening; Soil management; Water management; Horticulture – Grafting, Agroforestry; Mushroom; Post-harvest, Rural entrepreneurship development.

A total of 108 trainees completed their training while 94 trainees are undergoing their training at two Bosco Reach Out centres of Joropara and Rongjeng.





Skill Training for Local Voluntary Health Workers under BOLGRIM project

On June 25 and 26, 2019 skills training for local voluntary health workers was organised at Head Office, Bosco Reach Out, Guwahati. The objective of the programme was to sensitise and upgrade the skills of the ASHA and Anganbadi workers. The training began with the lighting of the lamp followed by welcome speech by Fr. A. Jayaprakash, Executive Director of BRO. Ms. Minku Das, Project Coordinator of BRO delivered the keynote address. The resource person was Shri. Swarup Bhatta, Social Health Activist, NESPYM, Guwahati. The training programme was attended by total number of 20 ASHA and Anganbadi workers from TDF project villages of Goalpara district.

The main discussed topics of the programme includes what is healthy community, knowing about health, hygiene and illness, infectious diseases like tuberculosis, leprosy and malaria, maternal health, new born care, infant and young child nutrition, reproductive diseases and care, etc. He also talked of the key components of the National Rural Health Mission which is to provide every village in the country with a trained female community health activist ASHA (Accredited Social Health Activist). ASHA are trained to work as an interface between the community and the public health system. For the reason, mainly ASHA workers and other local voluntary health workers were selected for the above skill training as refresher course, so that they can perform their duty more effectively.





Health Education Session for Women under BAGAN Project

Two programmes on health education session for women were organised in two different villages of Indrapur and Latari, Chirang district on June 21 and 22, 2019 respectively. Smt. Charnaboti Narzary, ASHA worker and Smt. Linu Basumatary, Anganwadi worker from Belguri, and Ms. Bilaitri Daimary, ASHA worker from Indrapur were the resource person for the two programmes. The topics covered were immunization and cleanliness for new born babies and infants and care during pregnancy and vaccination with objectives to create awareness on importance Immunization for babies and women health related problems, a platform for village women to discuss their health problems related to reproductive and child care, awareness on institutional deliveries, vaccination for pregnant women and new born children, awareness on balance diet for pregnant women to reduce anaemia in pregnant and lactating women, awareness to early and safe abortion services.

The resource persons explained about Mission Indradhanush, a health mission of the government of India which aims to immunize all children under the age of 2 years, as well as all pregnant women, against seven vaccine preventable diseases. The diseases being targeted are diphtheria, whooping cough, tetanus, poliomyelitis, tuberculosis, measles and Hepatitis B. The mission follow planning and administration like PPI (Pulse Polio Immunization). A total of 45 women attended the programme. The participants were happy as they could discuss their health related issues freely with resource person. They also cleared different types of myths regarding various diseases, disorder of health related to women.





General Medical Camp for Flood Affected Flood, Assam

On August 6 to 9, 2019 General medical camp was conducted by Bosco Reach Out in collaboration with Jeevana Samridhi, Nalla Ayalkaram Project, Pallarivattom, Kochi. The medical camp was conducted for four days at five places which include Nagarbahi, Mangaldai of Darrang District, Salmaripum of Morigaon district, Jonia, Pathsala, and Mohia of Barpeta district. A Medical Team of two female doctors, one male nurse and one female nurse from Jeevana Samridhi, Nalla Ayalkaram Project, Pallarivattom, Kochi along with four staff of Bosco Reach Out carried the general medical camp for the flood affected people of Assam. The medical camp was attended by men, women and children which includes 111 patients from Nagarbahi, Mangaldai, Darrang district, 226 patients from Salmaripum, Morigaon district, 210 people from Jonia, Barpeta district, 75 patients from Pathsala, Barpeta district and 440 patients from Mohia, Barpeta district.

During the camp the stakeholder and the volunteer helped the team in organising the programme. The medical team divided their responsibilities like, nurse checking the BP, the doctors checking the patients and prescribing medicine and ORS Liquid, and one nurse distributing the medicines as per the doctor's prescription, etc. The Bosco Reach Out staff maintained the decorum of the camp. Awareness on health and sanitation during and after flood was given by medical team to the participants. The awareness on seven hygienic points to keep the people healthy during and after flood mentioned includes; Wash the hand properly before and after food, Cover the eatables to protect them from flies, Eat different varieties of green vegetables, Clean the utensils which are to be used for food items, Disinfect the wells by pouring bleaching powder, Wash the cloth with dettol soap or liquid, Rush to the nearest health care centre for loose motion, vomiting or high fever (especially for children).

Most of the people were affected by skin diseases, fever, and dysentery. The medical team manage to treat the patients successfully. Medicines and ORS Liquid were given according to need of the patients. Bleaching powder was also distributed to the people.

Bosco Reach Out Socio -Developmental Centre, Umrangso, Dima Hasao district of Assam observed the day with a symbolic plantation of plants around their centre by the computer training students. World Environment Day was celebrated with school children of TDF - BAGAN project area villages, Sidli block, Chirang district of Assam to promote eco-friendly behaviour among kids. Different types of saplings were planted in public places, school premises, market places, etc.
