Dear Friends,

I am pleased to share with you the many accomplishments and blessings that our organization has experienced in the first quarter of the year 2023-2-24. We are grateful for the collaboration and hard work of everyone involved in our mission to promote the development of society.

One of our most exciting achievements was the establishment and inauguration of Green Skills Training Centre at Joropara, North Garo Hills, Meghalaya. This long-awaited project has finally come to fruition, and we are thrilled to have launched our first batch of solar technician trainees in March 2023. Additionally, we have launched two new programmes, the Micro Enterprise Development Program (MEDP) on Improved Methods of Pig Farming in Dibrugarh and Goalpara districts, and the first two batches of trainees have already begun their training.

We have also been active in our efforts to support children in need. Our annual sports day for Children at Risk Education (CARE) brought together all the children from our CARE centres, and we provided educational exposure outings for selected CARE children to visit Guwahati and experience the outside world. Furthermore, we organized a State Level Training of Master Trainers and Down Training of TI (Targeted Intervention) Staff and Out-Reach Workers (ORW) of the North Eastern states of India. We also conducted free eye screening camps for school students within our operational areas.

We are happy to be working towards the development of tribal communities through our five Integrated Tribal Development Programmes in the Dibrugarh and Goalpara districts of Assam and West Kameng district of Arunachal Pradesh.

We extend our sincere thanks to all our project partners and collaborators for their constant support.

I would like to highlight one of my personal experiences of a noble work/service of a mother in the society. Rupa is a true example of compassion and empathy. As a family mother who takes her son to a nearby school daily, she witnessed the struggles, humiliations, and cries of a security guard who was a stranger to her. Despite not knowing the guard personally, Rupa felt compelled to help him after learning about his difficult circumstances. As a result, she reached out to her network and helped him secure a decent and honorable job. Rupa's act of kindness serves as a powerful reminder that sometimes even small gestures of kindness and empathy can make a significant difference in the lives of strangers.

On 23 February 2023, BRO organised Annual Sports Day for the CARE centres at 2 No Salbari in Lungsung, Kokrajhar district of Assam. Fr Januarius S Sangma, the Salesian Provincial of Guwahati and the chief guest for the occasion encouraged the children to pay equal attention to their studies as the interest shown in sports. The dignitaries present included Fr Francis Basumatary, the Rector of Don Bosco Kokrajhar, Fr Thomas Lakra, the Parish Priest of St. Xavior Dotma, Fr Pascal Dungdung from Don Bosco Amguri, Fr Ignatius Gari, Associate Director of Bosco Reach out, who were all felicitated with a Santhali panchi each. The children warmly welcomed them by showering flower petals and waving balloons.



The sport's day began with a march past and hoisting of the school flag by the chief guest. The CARE teachers performed a Dasai dance, the cultural dance of the Santhali. The children joyfully took part in a variety of competitive activities like running race, biting biscuits, musical chair, slow cycle race, relay race, filling of bottles and frog race. This year Bow and Arrow game had been added to encourage the children to compete at the district level. The day also witnessed enchanting performances of a Bodo dance and a Santali dance. The

tug-o-war for the mothers' group and prize distributions for the winners concluded the day. The chief guest lowered the flag and handed over the flag to the chief organizer and declared the Annual Sports Day closed.

The event successfully demonstrated the laudable changes over the past years in their performances in March Past, games and discipline on the field. We thank the coordinators and teachers of CARE schools for their hard work put in to make the Annual Sports Day a grand success.





Farmers Training and Demonstration

BRO conducted training and demonstration on kiwi plantation from 7 February to 2 March 2023, covering nine villages of the project area (Ramda, Palizi, Balipho, Subu, Tania, Tuluhi, Kaya Valley, Gijiri, Phrizin) under Thrizino Block of West Kameng District of Arunachal Pradesh. The Project Coordinator together with the field staff made the farmers understand the scientific method of kiwi plantation right from land preparation to pit digging and the plantation management procedures to be followed. They also used leaflets and audiovisual media to ensure that the farmers understood topic well enough.

Under the project "Integrated Tribal Development Programme for Thrizino Block in West Kameng District, Arunachal Pradesh State", each of the 201 farmer beneficiaries received 30 kiwi saplings (27 female and 3 male). 75% of the beneficiaries have already completed the kiwi plantation so far. Last year, farmers received planting materials of plums and boundary plants (mahogany and Malaysian sal). In April 2023 they will be provided walnut saplings so as to ensure complete wadi development with as kiwi, plum and walnut as the main crops.

During this quarter, three more farmers' training and demonstration programmes were conducted at Chirang district under the project "Integrated Tribal Development Programme for Sidli block in Chirang District, Assam". The main crops of the wadi/orchard are orange, apple ber and arecanut. These programmes are supported by NABARD Arunachal Pradesh and Assam, respectively in Trizino block and Sidli block.









Improved Methods of Pig Farming

BRO inaugurated two programmes, "Micro Enterprise Development Programme (MEDP) on Improved Methods of Pig Farming" on 6 February 2023 at the Project site office, Bholai Na Gaon, Barbaruah block of Dibrugarh, and on 22 February 2023 at Chechapani part-III, Kushdowa block of Goalpara, respectively. Present on the occasion were NABARD personnel from Assam (DDM of Goalpara and Dibrugarh), Local Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) of Moran Constituency, Assam State Rural Livelihood Mission (ASRLM) personnel, Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) personnel, Panchayat members, Ward Members, Master Trainers, Village Headmen, Bosco Reach Out personnel, and the trainees. The programmes are aimed to establish sustainable micro-enterprises through trained SHG members. A total of 150 SHG members, in a batch of 30 participants, will receive the required training.

The resource persons, Mr Arup Rabha, Master Trainer Goalpara and Dr Chitrajyoti Chetia, District Piggery Sector Officer Dibrugarh, provide theoretical and practical inputs on enterprise management, business awareness, rural market dynamics, achievement motivation, simple accounting procedures and skill development training.

These trainings for the SHG members belong to two BRO's implementing projects "Integrated Tribal

Development Project at Barbaruah Block, Dibrugarh District, Assam" and "Integrated Tribal Development Programme in Kusdhowa Development Block, Goalpara District, Assam".



State Level Training of Master Trainers (ToT)

Bosco Reach Out, the Kshamta Kendra (TI Training Institute) for the capacity building of TI (Targeted Intervention) and LWS (Link Workers Scheme) staff of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, Mizoram and Sikkim under Prashiksha (Blended Training) organised State Level Training of Master Trainers (ToT) at Guwahati, Assam from 7-10 February 2023, and at Aizawl, Mizoram from 21-24 February 2023. The aim is to build the capacities and skills of government healthcare providers, including medical officers,



nurses, and laboratory personnel across the country. It is an initiative of the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO), Assam State AIDS Control Society (ASACS), supported by The Global Fund. A total of 54 master trainers attended the training programme.

They discussed on various topics which included the following: Blended Training and TI Capacity Building Programme; Training Methodology and Facilitation Skills; Introduction to Health System; National Health Policy and National HIV/AIDS Programme and HIV/AIDS (Adherence to ART is Critical, ART is Accessible to All); Introduction to TB and STI and Hepatitis B & C; Elimination of Mother to Child Transmission of HIV and Syphilis; Understanding Core Groups and Targeted Intervention under NACP; Roles and Responsibilities of Outreach Workers; Interpersonal Communication Skills Building; Gender, Sex and Sexuality; Community-Based Screening; Cold Chain Management and Biomedical Waste Management; Commodity Provision; Stakeholder Management and Analysis; Crisis Intervention; The HIV and AIDS

(Prevention and Control) Act, 2017; Outreach Activities; Harm Reduction Strategy; Newer Initiatives in HIV prevention, Peer Educator Selection and Training, Referrals and Networking; and Record Maintenance and Reporting; and Monitoring and Evaluation Tools practice sessions.

The Master Trainers suggested a few more programmes at regular intervals to get a better orientation on the current updates and guidelines that will enhance their confidence during their teach-back sessions.





Down Training of TI Staff – Out Reach Workers (ORW)

The first batch of five-day programme on Down Training of TI (Targeted Intervention) Project Staff – Out Reach Workers (ORW), under Prashiksha (Blended Training), was organised for 22 TI NGOs from 14 to 18 March 2023 at Bosco Reach Out Guwahati, Assam. The second batch was conducted for 26 participants of 25 TI NGOs from 25 to 29 March 2023 at Inspiration, Guwahati. It is an initiative of the National AIDS Control Organization (NACO), Assam State AIDS Control Society (ASACS), supported by The Global Fund.



The Master Trainers covered the following topics: Introduction to the Health System; HIV/ AIDS; TB & STI & RTI; and Hepatitis B & C; Comprehensive EMTCT; Understanding Core Groups; Understanding Targeted Interventions under NACP, Continuing, Revamped Strategy, and Changing Patterns; Roles & Responsibilities of ORWs; Interpersonal Communication (IPC) & Skill Building; Gender, Sex & Sexuality; Community-Based Screening; Crisis Intervention; The HIV and AIDS Prevention and Control Act 2017; Out Reach Activities; Harm Reduction; Newer Initiatives in HIV Prevention; Peer Educator Selection & Training; Exposure Visit; Referrals & Network; and Record Maintenance and Reporting; and Monitoring and Evaluation.





Free Eye Screening Camp

Bosco Reach Out (BRO) initiated, with its available resources, free eye screening camps to contribute to the reduction of avoidable blindness through a comprehensive eye care programme in its operational areas among school-going children and youth starting from January 2023.

BRO could conduct three free eye screening within Guwahati city on 31 January, 18 March and 25 March at Happy Child School, K C Das Commerce College and KRB Girls College respectively. More than 590 students, 80 teachers and 8 nonteaching staff received free eye screening test of which 79 patients got prescription for glasses and counselling. Two of them were diagnosed with retinal disease and referred to eye hospital for further treatment while one was diagnosed with cataract and referred to hospital for cataract surgery.

The programme started with a checking of vision. Anyone detected having less than 6/9 vision was sent for a refraction test and provided a glass prescription if needed. Suspected of other ocular diseases were referred to a nearby eye hospital. During the screening, the students received counselling on the importance of using glasses and the required precautions to maintain healthy eyesight. Overall, the programme was quite successful and achieved positive feedback from the students and teachers regarding the services provided.







Exposure Visit for FPO Members

n 4 March 2023, under the project "Integrated Tribal Development Programme for Sidli block, Chirang district, Assam (BAGAN Project)", 10 members of Malivita Dairy Milk Cooperative Society (FPO), accompanied by Mr Jion Narzary, the Project Field Coordinator of Bosco Reach Out, had an educational exposure visit to Birangana Mahila Producer Co. Ltd. located at Bongaigaon district. The above company is seven years old, with 2081 members, running Mustard Processing Unit and Turmeric Processing Unit. The purpose of the exposure was to observe, understand and learn the functioning of other Farmer Producer Companies (FPC) and to create an informal platform for group exchange and interaction where farmers of another group can share their experiences as an organisation.

The FPO members interacted with the president and member of the Birangana Farmer Producer Company. They studied the FPC's units and were impressed by the spirit of cooperation and collaboration among the group members. They also learnt about the effective way of running the FPC, where the individual farmer generates income from their products while contributing to the growth of their organisation.

Malivita Dairy Milk Cooperative Society (FPO), comprising 400 wadi beneficiaries, was formed under the project ITDF for Sidli block, Chirang district, Assam. Apart from horticulture activities, the farmers have a collective weaving unit and dairy.









Crash Course Coaching for 10th Standard

A crash course coaching for 10th standard was conducted for one week, from 25 February to 2 March 2023, at its project implementing area under the project, "Integrated Tribal Development Programme for Sidli block, Chirang district, Assam (BAGAN Project)" with the support of NABARD, Assam. It aims to help the Class X students be better prepared for the final examinations. Four teachers and the president of the All Bodo Students Union (ABSU) were involved in taking the classes. They guided the students to study and write their examinations better by providing them with tips and suggestions. A total of 33 students appearing for the forthcoming HSLC Examinations attended the classes. The Director of BRO send his best wishes to all students with a pencil pouch containing a pen, a pencil, an eraser and a sharper.

The crash course coaching provided a platform where the students discussed and cleared their doubts. It helped them to utilize their free for their studies. It further helped in creating an awareness about the importance of education. The students were very regular in attending the classes. They showed great enthusiasm for learning. They promised to obtain good results and study further and excel in life. We wish them the very best for their examinations.





Educational Day Out for CARE Children

n 19 January 2023, the children of CARE (Children at Risk Education) had an educational day out. The selected 35 children for the outing were among those who were outspoken with better performance in studies. The Cluster Coordinators of CARE, Mr Pabithra Musahary and Mr Kesab Ekka, and the Community Educators of CARE, Mrs Paulina Mardi and Mrs Puspa Baskey, accompanied them to Guwahati.

They visited the State Zoo and the Regional Science Museum in Guwahati. It was an exciting day for them. It was their first visit to Guwahati. They felt privileged on being selected from among many of their friends to make this trip. They were thrilled to see a huge rock and a large stone on the way to Guwahati. They expressed their gratitude and appreciated the trip heartily. These are the children who will be our future leaders. Accelerating Change to Solve the Water and Sanitation Crisis

Bosco Reach Out, the Implementation Support Agency of the project Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM), conducted various activities on the occasion of World Water Day, 2023 with the theme "Accelerating change to solve the water and sanitation crisis" from 1-20 March 2023, in 5 selected villages (Kurkuript – II / Kurkuri GP, Kurkuri Pt-III / Kurkuri GP, Tarapur / Kalain GP, Chali Gram / Kalain GP, and Sundaura / Kurkuri GP) of Cachar district, Assam. The activities



carried out included selection of 5 villages with functional PWSS (Piped Water Supply Scheme), trained & active Women FTK Groups, active Water User Committee as per guideline; Data Collection (on behavioural changes under JJM: A case study in Kalain); Focus Group Discussion (FGD); Water Quality Testing via Field Testing Kits (FTKs); Rallies by women & school children and Gram sabha; Community meeting; Cluster meeting; Women Group meeting.

The objectives of the programme were to facilitate accelerating change to solve the water and sanitation issues, to create awareness among the communities about water and sanitation practices and its importance for health security, to assess social impact from Jal Jeevan Mission infrastructure, to facilitate a self-appraisal process by the benefit derived thereof, and to ensure ownership towards JJM approach among the community via CAPEX (Capital Expenditure) & OPEX (Operational Expenditure) contribution.





Child Rights and Children's Group Formation Workshop



B osco Reach Out organised a three-day workshop on Child Rights and Children's Group Formation, as a capacity building for the staff, from 16-18 January 2023 at its Head Office, Guwahati with the support of Childaid Network, Austria. A total of 16 delegates from three different projects attended the workshop. It aimed to raise the understanding of the importance of child rights and the children's group formation and to encourage and improve the application of the child rights approach in schools.

Resource persons, Ms Pragati and Mr Abhijit from IDEA, the Ant, discussed about various topics which included the following:- Four Pillars of Child Rights (Right to Survival, Right to Development, Right to Participation and Right to Protection); United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child; Constitutional Provisions; Schemes for the Child Rights in India; Gender Equality; Equality; Equity and Inclusivity; Give advantage to the lower ones; Understand our Life and Others; Critical thinking; and Four Pillars of School (Teacher, Student, SMC and Parents/Guardians).

"Privileged to attend such a beautiful training programme. I learned many things. I will implement what I learnt here in my school so that every child enjoys and gets their rights. Let all children live a dignified life", expressed Mr Daud Soren, the CARE Cluster Coordinator of BRO who attended the workshop.





Right to Access Conceptual Education

Bosco Reach Out implements the Right to Access Conceptual Education (RACE) Project in twelve schools within two clusters (six schools in Donkamukam and six schools in Satgaon Cluster), West Karbi Anglong district of Assam with the support of Childaid Network, Austria. All the schools have completed their Final Scholastic Examinations and remain closed for a month with their new session commencing from April 2023.



During this school holiday period, the RACE Project

staff come to the school to prepare for the new academic year through preparations of Teaching Learning Materials (TLM), Lesson Plans and Worksheets. Teaching Learning Material (TLM) makes teaching more comprehensive and effective in the classroom. TLM also motivates the learners, helps in longer retention of information, facilitates holistic learning, helps in organizing classroom teaching, facilitates change in attitude, practical applications, making learning fun and concept-based. The Lesson Plan provides a productive lesson in which the students and the teacher learn from each other. TLMs and Lesson Plans help to prepare the worksheet of the students' activities and assignments.

The teachers, for the first time, after getting training, are enthusiastic and mentally ready with the teaching materials to teach their students in the new academic session 2023.

Investor Awareness Programme



On Bosco Job Placement Network Guwahati under Bosco Reach Out held an investor awareness programme in partnership with the Bombay Stock Exchange on 3 February 2023 at Don Bosco University, Azara campus, Assam. The programme was attended by 79 final-year students and faculties of Don Bosco University. The event was facilitated by Mr Johnny Jacob, the Placement Coordinator of BRO. In all more than 100 participants attended the event.

Bombay Stock Exchange personnel explained the fundamentals of financial planning, stock investments and investment securities. The session provided the students with valuable knowledge and insight into the world of investments. The participants showed keen interest in the topic. They expressed their desire to learn more and willingness to attend more such sessions. They thanked Bosco Reach Out and Bombay Stock Exchange for organising such an enriching event.



Unlocking Career Potential

On 30 January 2023, Don Bosco Job Placement Network Guwahati under Bosco Reach Out, in collaboration with National Career Service, Guwahati organised a career counselling session for the students of ICON Commerce College, Guwahati. More than 80 students attended the counselling session. The event aimed to help the students to identify their strengths, interests, and career goals and to provide them with the proper guidance and resources to make informed decisions for their future, so that they can be successful in their chosen professions.



Bosco Reach Out and National Career Service personnel discussed the scope of the commerce stream, various opportunities after graduating in commerce stream, and options for further studies and achievements. The students provided their bio data along with their areas of interest in work. This will enhance their chances of getting a job as soon as they complete their graduation. They expressed their satisfaction and thanked both the organisations. Nearly 50 percent of the students intended to work and earn a living while others choose to continue their higher studies.

Skill Training Course on Solar Technician Inaugurated

n 22 March 2023, Bosco Reach Out inaugurated the Skill Training Course on Solar Technicians for the first batch at Green Skills Training Centre, Joropara, blessed and inaugurated on 21 February this year. A total of twelve youth (six from Assam and six from Meghalaya state) enrolled for the first batch of training.



The inaugural programme began with the lighting of the lamp by Fr Jayaprakash Anthonimuthu, the Executive Director of BRO, Fr Ignatius Gari, the Associate Director of BRO, and Fr Charles Sangma, the Parish Priest of Mendal.

Fr Jayaprakash welcomed the students and encouraged them to learn well and get self-





employed. Fr Charles Sangma, the Parish Priest of Mendal, encouraged the first batch of students to work sincerely and complete the course successfully. He also thanked Bosco Reach Out for taking the initiative to establish the Green Skills Training Centre for the growth and development of their region and the whole of North East India.

The training is aimed at creating skilled solar technicians out of the trainees. The duration of the training is three months. The local market outlet will sell the solar items prepared by the trainees. In the coming years there will be more demand for solar equipments/devices in the market.
