It gives me great pleasure to share with you the remarkable progress and achievements by Bosco Reach Out (BRO) in the second quarter. As we continue our mission to serve and uplift the underprivileged and vulnerable communities, our dedicated team are continuing their work diligently to make a positive impact on the lives of many.

The Free Eye Screening Camp has been one of our significant initiatives, providing comprehensive eye care to school-going children and youth in our operational areas. In this quarter alone, we successfully conducted five eye screening camps, benefiting over 3,300 students and 500 faculties. We provided 1,500 glasses prescriptions and offered counselling sessions on eye health and care. Moreover, we identified and recommended treatment for amblyopic eyes and referred more than 200 cases for cataract treatment. Our efforts have been well received by schools, and we are delighted to witness the appreciation from the students and faculties.

Another milestone was the Inauguration and Launching of the ITDP Project in Khowang dist. of Dibrugarh. On 22 May 2023, we had the honour of inaugurating this Sericulture-Based Non-Wadi Project, aimed at bringing about holistic development for the community. The event was graced by esteemed dignitaries and government officials, and it was very much encouraging to witness their support and appreciation for project under taken.

Our commitment to safe migration is reflected in the Sensitization and Awareness Programme on Migrant. By reaching out to village leaders and young, potential migrant workers, we aim to promote safe migration practices and empower individuals with knowledge on legal documents and potential risks. The enthusiastic response from the participants further reinforces our dedication to creating awareness on this critical issue.

Our education-related initiatives, such as the School Management Committee meetings and the Training of Trainers for RACE and CARE projects, have been pivotal in promoting quality education. We are proud to witness the active participation of SMC members and mothers' groups, as they join hands to support children's education. Additionally, the training sessions for teachers and coordinators have contributed significantly in improving teaching methodologies and learning outcomes.

Our various training programmes have been instrumental in uplifting livelihoods and empowering individuals with valuable skills. The Training on Electrical cum Solar Technician and Skill Upgradation Training for Weavers have equipped the participants with knowledge that will enhance their employability and income-generating capabilities. ## Free Eye Screening Camp

Starting from January 2023, Bosco Reach Out had been conducting free eye screening camps with its available resources intending to contribute to the reduction of avoidable blindness through a comprehensive eye care programme in its operational areas among school-going children and youth. During this quarter, BRO completed five free eye screening camps for different schools within Guwahati region. Till date, 3300 students and 500 faculties received free eye screening tests. More than 1500 prescriptions for glasses were provided among students. Counselling session on eye health was also simultaneously conducted for every school. Around 100 students were found to have amblyopic eye and recommended to go for eye patch exercises and therapy. More than 200 were referred to hospitals for cataract (teaching staff and non-teaching staff) treatment.

The programme usually starts with the checking of vision. Anyone detected having less than 6/9 vision was sent for a refraction test and provided a glass prescription if needed. Suspected of other ocular diseases were referred to a nearby eye hospital. During the screening, the students received counselling on the importance of using glasses and the required precautions to maintain healthy eyesight. The school faculties and students appreciative of the initiative of BRO. They are delighted to get free eye care services equipped with advanced technology at their school.



## Inauguration and Launching of ITDP Khowang, Dibrugarh Project



On 22 May 2023, the Sericulture-Based Non-Wadi Project in Khowang block of Dibrugarh district of Assam was launched and inaugurated in Tinthengia Panchayat Community Hall, Tinthengia, Dibrugarh district of Assam. The programme commenced with the lighting of the lamp by CGM of NABARD and the dignitaries present at the occasion followed by the State Anthem of ASSAM “O MUR APUNAR DEKH”. Fr. Jimmy T. Sangma, the Asst Director of BRO, felicitated the dignities with a bouquet and a traditional phoolan gamocha. In his welcome speech, Fr Jimmy clearly stated the purpose of the TDF Project and its benefit to society. The dignitaries present were Mr. Rameswar Teli the Honourable Central Minister for Petroleum and Natural Gas and Labour and Employment, Government of India, Mr. Naveen Dhingra, CGM of NABARD, Mr Bhaskar Parashar, DDM of NABARD, Mr. Dipak Nath, the Sericulture Project Officer of Sivasagar, Mr. Pranjal Gogoi, Deputy Handloom Officer Dibrugarh, Mr. Sunmoni Chowdhury, Functional Manager of DICC Dibrugarh, and Mr. Dulon Sonowal, President of Tinthengia Panchayat.

Mr. Bhaskar Parashar, DDM of NABARD, gave an overview of the project and its potentials. Other dignitaries from different line departments also spoke on how they could help the people technically or through various government schemes. Mr. Naveen Dhingra, the CGM of NABARD, expressed his happiness and overwhelming gratitude for the warm welcome, hospitality and a large gathering of the people. After the programme, he also spoke to the print and electronic media briefing about the project and its potential for the beneficiaries.

In the presence of the dignitaries, CGM of NABARD presented Kesseru saplings as a symbolic gesture to ten beneficiaries from selected villages of the project. Ms. Minku Das, the Project Coordinator of BRO delivered the vote-of-thanks. The inaugural programme concluded with the National Anthem. It was indeed a very memorable day for all, especially the beneficiaries.





## Sensitisation and Awareness Programmes on Issues of Migrant Workers



Bosco Reach Out, this year, initiated a project entitled, “Care and Support for Safe Migration in Two Districts of Assam”, with a focus on preparation of potential migrants and village leaders on Safe Migration. On 13 April 2023, BRO conducted a sensitisation and awareness programme for the village leaders on safe migration to support young potential migrant workers at Doomni Tea Estate, Baksa district of Assam. Another awareness programme was organised for young potential migrant workers on safe migration in the same area. Around 150 people, including village leaders and young migrants from two villages, attended the programmes. The programme focused on two categories of individuals, the leaders and common villagers and young potential migrants.

Fr. Ignatius Gari, Associate Director of BRO, in his message to the gathering spoke on migration for work and its negative and positive aspects, the reason for the migration of adults. He also explained about the need for record keeping by the village leaders to ensure to keep track of youth who migrant and to ensure safe migration. Ms. Sangeeta Das, Project Coordinator of BRO, explained and introduced the topic of migration to the people gathered. She spoke on the issues related to migrant workers, do's and don'ts while migrating, the need for important legal documents and the impact of migration. Pamphlets on the relevant topics were distributed to the participants.

The participants showed keen interest in learning about the subject. They were very active during the Q & A session to clarify the queries. They mentioned that many people migrate to the town for jobs and some for educational purposes. They were happy to attend the programme and assured to share their knowledge with their community.





## School Management Committee

School Management Committee (SMC) meeting in all the centres of the RACE (Right to Access Conceptual Education) project had been organised in the West Karbi Anglong district of Assam. In the meeting, the RACE staff shared the main motives and objectives of the RACE project along with the various activities. During the meeting, the SMC members conveyed their happiness that BRO is taking the initiative through the project to help the children to get quality education and were appreciative of the remedial classes being conducted in the adopted schools. SMC members requested the staff to encourage many children to attend remedial classes and create awareness of its benefits among the mother's groups. The head teachers are happy and thankful to BRO the support and for the initiative in their schools. The project aims to achieve the active participation of SMC members and the mother's groups in the children's education and the school. All the school SMCs agreed to have the regular monthly SMC meetings from July onward.



On 27 May 2023, an SMC meeting was held for the SMC of the Children at Risk Education (CARE) Project in 2. No. Salbari, Lungsung, Kokrajhar district of Assam. The meeting highlighted the importance of school infrastructure maintenance, students' regularity to class, and owning up of the school by looking after the welfare of the school and the students. The members gathered discussed about the importance of taking initiatives to develop the school unitedly for a cause. Mr. Cornelius Hembrom encouraged the SMCs to engage in cattle rearing and planting commercial crops for generating family income. They are very appreciative of the arecanut plantation undertaken in the school premises with a view to support the school in the future. This initiative has also encouraged them to undertake arecanut plantation in their own plots. The women present, expressed that there needs to be more unity in the village.



## Training of Trainers for Coordinators of CARE and RACE



A three-day “Training of Trainers” programme was organised from 19 to 21 April 2023 at Bosco Reach Out, Guwahati. Coordinators of the CARE (Children at Risk Education) project and Coordinators and teachers of the RACE (Right to Access Conceptual Education) project attended the training. The trainer personnel were Ms. Sushmita, Ms. Esther and Mr. Milan of Pratham, Research and Development Institute, Delhi. They were knowledgeable and enthusiastic and engaged the trainees with different activities, discussions and hands-on practice sessions. The training programme was an enlightening and informative experience for all the trainees. The programme covered a wide range of topics related to the Lower Primary class, including lesson plans, classroom management, English curriculum, numeracy, language and teaching and evaluation methods.

Through the training, the trainees learned to design effective lesson plans for focus and non-focus groups, manage multilevel classrooms, record data accurately and efficiently, teach language and

numeracy concepts through engaging activities and assess children’s learning progress. Moreover, the training provided a supportive and collaborative environment where trainees could share their experiences and ideas, ask questions and receive feedback.



## Staff Training and Exposure Visit: Barbaruah



On 25 June 2023, BRO organised 'Staff Training and Exposure Visit on Value Addition of Yarn by using Developed Techniques and Machines' for staff of the project 'Sericulture based non-wadi project in Barbaruah block of Dibrugarh district, Assam' with the support of NABARD, Assam. They visited Sualkuchi, a weaving centre in Assam, known for its traditional silk textiles weaving, said to date back to 11th century AD, located on the banks of the Brahmaputra, about 35 km from the state capital Dispur.

The staff interacted with different weavers for the technology transfer. They gained knowledge on the functioning of different Jacquards. They learned about the various raw materials and tools of jacquard loom. They were impressed by the unique variety of designs and materials of silk textiles products. They are enlightened to build the capacity of the silk weavers or project beneficiaries to enhance their weaving skills and weave a unique product to meet the market demand.





## Free Health Camp: Barbaruah



On 29 April and 14 May 2023, Bosco Reach Out organised two health camps on Naturopathy and Hammer Therapy for the village people in the BRO Project Site Office Bolai Na Gaon, Barbaurah block, Dibrugarh district of Assam where Sericulture-based non-wadi project is being implemented with the support of NABARD, Assam.



Shri. Sukamal Deori, Hammer Therapist of Dhemaji, provided his health care service to 181 patients (62 males and 119 females). He treated them for joint and hip pains during the two health camps. The majority of the patients came from the surrounding villages. Ms. Sabita Saikia of Khowang, Ms. Kusumika Hazarika of Bolai Na Gaon and Mr. Monuj Sonowal of Bolai Na Gaon have shown remarkable and positive changes in their health. People are very thankful to NABARD and Bosco Reach Out for providing them with the opportunity to be treated naturally.

## Training on Electrical cum Solar Technician



Bosco Reach Out conducted a four-month (23 February to 26 June 2023) training for electrical cum solar technicians at the Skill Development Centre at Mendal, North Garo Hills, Meghalaya. The trainees were Class X and XII appeared students waiting for the results and school dropout students. The first batch of 16 (sixteen) students completed the course successfully and received the completion certificate. The trainees learnt the different types of electricity generation, basics of electricity, electrical circuits, electrical components, introduction to solar energy, solar radiation, types of solar technology, PV cell, solar module characteristics and specification, LED with solar module, series and parallel configuration, wires, cables and connector. Apart from the electrical and solar training, they were provided classes on spoken English, grammar and basic computer skills. They were very keen on learning and attended the classes with great interest. Over four months of stay and training has made them confident and disciplined.

On 26 June 2023, BRO organised certification and closing ceremony day for the first batch of trainees. Fr. Jimmy Sangma, Asst. Director of Bosco Reach Out, Fr. Benny, Director of Skill Development Centre Mendal, Mr. Ezekiel Chawang, Project Coordinator of Bosco Reach Out, Mr.



Krimchang Momin, Trainer of BRO, Ms. Lucy Sangma and Ms. Judistira Marak were present for the same. Fr. Jimmy and Fr. Benny congratulated and wished the trainees the best in their future endeavours. The trainees expressed their gratitude to BRO and the teachers for all the support, care and guidance throughout their stay. The second batch of training is due to start in July 2023.





## Health Awareness Programme: Sidli

On 29 May 2023, BRO conducted a health awareness programme - a free mental and general health check-up camp at Malivita, an ITDF (Integrated Tribal Development Fund) project area. The project aims to bring about holistic development for the community. Dr Suhasini Das, MBBS, MD (Psy) FIPS, Neuropsychiatrist from Apollo Diagnostics and Healthcare, Six Mile, Guwahati, rendered her services for the health camp.

Around 76 patients of the 40 to 60 age group received free health check-up from the doctor. The common health issues of the patients were hypertension, diabetes, general body weakness and gastritis. There were a few psychiatric patients with anxiety disorder, depression and stress. BRO also helped to provide free medications like Stamlo (Amlodipine), Rantac, Shelcal, Cheri, Becosule and Lopez, as per the doctor's prescriptions. The doctor prescribed blood investigations and asked to follow up as required. The patients were very grateful to the doctor and BRO for organising free check-up camp in their village which was very convenient for them.





## Farmer Producer Organisation Business Plan Training: Sidli



On 14 April 2023, BRO conducted a need-based training on the FPO business plan at the BRO Project Site Office, Tilapara, Chirang district of Assam, to make the FPO members aware about the FPO business plan, functioning and its importance. The resource person was Shri Biku Basumatary, CEO of Malivita Dairy Milk FPO Cooperative Society Ltd and around 26 FPO members attended the training.

He explained the business planning through strategic and operational orientation of an emerging FPO. A business plan with proper projections on various aspects is to be developed where participating FPO members provide a clear vision. The proposed FPO business activities included trading, buying and selling, procurement of crops and farm production. The FPO in the business will provide services of technology and doorstep delivery of inputs - seeds and fertilizers.

At present, the FPO members carry out various activities of paddy cultivation, vegetable cultivation, jute cultivation, rapeseed and mustard cultivation, castor cultivation, arecanut plantation, orange plantation and livestock rearing.





## Staff Capacity Training: Kusdhowa



On 11 April and 01 June 2023, at BRO Project Site Office Chechapani pt-III, staff training was conducted for the new project, ITDP at Kusdhowa block, Goalpara district, Assam by Ms. Minku Das, the Project Coordinator (Agriculture) of BRO and Mr. M. Zamal, Project Assistant of BRO, to improve knowledge on the scientific method of horticulture plantation and management practices, create awareness on the selection of varieties of horticulture crop, upgrade skill on nursery raising to provide quality extension services through improving the knowledge of the staff. Building staff capacity on developmental works along with technical knowledge is very important. Therefore, the training also aimed to enhance the skill needed to carry out the job, influencing change in staff attitude and behaviour by raising awareness and understanding of social work, supervising staff through monitoring, teaching and guidance and instituting a system for staff accountability.

Elaborately, they discussed the role of the Project Level Tribal Development Committee, the formation of participant groups and the village planning committee. In the next quarter, on the 4 and 5 July 2023, at KVK Dudhnoi, there will be another staff training on the technical knowledge of mango, litchi, and other selected project crop cultivation methods and management practices.





## Promotion and Mobilization: Kusdhowa & Khowang

Bosco Reach Out conducted the promotion and mobilization programme for the new projects in the Kusdhowa block of the Goalpara district and the Khowang block of the Dibrugarh district in Assam. It was a routine visit to all the selected villages and also door to door visit by the project staff to share the project concept, motivate the farmers to join in the project and take signatures on the consent letter.



The programme was to share with villagers in informal gatherings when villagers were free. BRO adopted different methods like personal meetings, home visits, small group meetings and community meetings for awareness and mobilization of the farmers and to disseminate the project concept. During this quarter, more than 190 participants from 9 villages of the two districts in Assam have been mobilized and agreed to participate in the project supported by NABARD, Assam. At the same time, after examining the land documents of the participants for the Wadi establishment, consent letters were signed by the participants to confirm their willingness to participate in the project were collected.





## Organic Farming

Bosco Reach Out has conducted Organic Farming Training in the project areas of Tezpur, Boko, Kumarikatta, Goalpara and Karbi Anglong regions of Assam. The training focuses on creating awareness among the farmers that organic farming is a form of agriculture that relies on techniques like crop rotation, green manure, compost and biological pest



control to maintain soil productivity and control pests in the field. It excludes or strictly limits the uses of synthetic fertilizers and synthetic pesticides. It is the pathway that leads us to live in harmony with nature. The benefits of organic farming include the low cost of external input and investment, safe and healthy foods and water, minimizes environmental pollution and the use of non-renewable natural resources, and conserves soil fertility and prevents soils erosion.

The training encouraged the farmers to use biopesticides as pest control techniques, viz, chilli, garlic, ginger extract, cow urine solution, neem leaf extract, neem cake decoction, plant leaf extract, wood ash and cow dung solution. The farmers gained new knowledge from the training. Many farmers are already using organic farming techniques in their home kitchen gardens on an experimental basis which have proven to be successful.



## Demonstration on Adaptation Technologies to Climate Change in the Agriculture Sector

Bosco Reach Out conducted training on keyhole farming for Cluster Level Federation and Self-Help Group leaders at Tezpur, Goalpara and Karbi Anglong. This new way of family farming is a perfect solution for hot and dry areas, rocky, compact, shallow and arid soils.



A keyhole garden is usually circular in shape with a compost bin in the middle to add water and biodegradable trash to serve as a compost placed in the middle of this little farm, bordered by a wall made of rocks, bricks or wood.

Farm management of keyhole gardens is simple and sustainable. Kitchen and garden waste are used as a fertilizer to bring nutrients to the soil, and water for irrigation comes from household wastewater. The scheme of this farming practice is significant in adapting to the impact of climate change.



## Skill Upgradation Training for Weavers

Bosco Reach Out conducted two batches (60 weavers) of Skill Upgradation Training for Weavers, a non-farm sector, Livelihood and Enterprise Development Programme, at its Project Site Office at Barbaruah block, Dibrugarh district of Assam. They weavers learned the use of Jacquard on Fly



Shuttle Looms and producing different value-added products of ERI Silk. Mr. Sunit Mohan, Master Trainer of Jacquard, from Sivasagar district, was the resource person.

The object of the training is to promote on-hand training on the construction and use of the Warping Drum, familiarise and train the weavers on the use of Throw Shuttle Looms, to acquaint and train the weavers on the use of dobby/jacquard machine for designing, orient the weavers' community towards manufacturing their products more professionally, familiarize weavers' community with the supply chain management and merchandising, and bridge the gap between the weavers' community and the global market.





## Livestock Management

Three days of Livestock management training, especially on pig farming, has been conducted by Bosco Reach Out in the project-implementing regions of Tezpur, Boko, Kumarikata, Goalpara and Karbi Anglong. Mr. Ezekiel, the Project Coordinator of BRO, along with the respective region's Field Extension Staff of BRO, conducted the training. Pig rearing is common livestock farming practice in rural areas for consumption and income generation activity. The topics discussed during the training include livestock housing management, type of breed, type of breeding, method of cross breed, selection of breeding gilt and breeding boar, heat detection – the common signs of heat, how to induce heat, disease and Parasite.

The farmers were happy to learn many new ideas about rearing their livestock. They mentioned that the perspectives of livestock farming they have learned will surely enhance the productivity of the livestock.





## Children Sponsorship Children

Since 1999, Bosco Reach Out has been helping the most vulnerable poor children from Assam and Meghalaya to pursue their schooling with the support of Fondazione Fratelli Dimenticati Onlus, Italy. More than 4500 children received an education. The children are doing well in their studies. Many have completed their studies and work in government departments, companies, institutions and hospitals, while some are self-employed. The programme has enlightened the parents and communities to lead a meaningful life through spreading education in primary and secondary and at a higher level of technical education. This year there are 738 school-going underprivileged children in 21 centres (10 centres in Assam and 11 centres in Meghalaya) enjoying the benefits of the Children's Sponsorship Programme.

During May and June, 103 Class X sponsored children and 23 Class XII sponsored children passed their HSCL and HS examinations. The Teachers, Parents, Centre-in-Charges and children are happy and expressed their heartfelt gratitude to Bosco Reach Out and Fondazione Fratelli Dimenticati Onlus, Italy. BRO wish all the sponsored children congratulation and God's blessing in their future endeavours.



# Extraordinary Visitation



On 16 May 2023, the Bosco Reach Out family warmly welcomed Rev. Fr. George Chalissery SDB, the Extraordinary Visitor, delegated by the Rector Major of the Salesians from Rome for the extraordinary visitation of the Province of Guwahati. On 17 May, the BRO staff officially welcomed him with a traditional phoolan gamosa, a BRO scarf and a bouquet. Fr.
